Acts 3:1-8 CSB

Now Peter and John were going up to the temple for the time of prayer at three in the afternoon. [2] A man who was lame from birth was being carried there. He was placed each day at the temple gate called Beautiful, so that he could beg from those entering the temple.

[3] When he saw Peter and John about to enter the temple, he asked for money.

[4] Peter, along with John, looked straight at him and said, "Look at us."

[5] So he turned to them, expecting to get something from them.

[6] But Peter said, "I don't have silver or gold, but what I do have, I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!"

[7] Then, taking him by the right hand he raised him up, and at once his feet and ankles became strong.

[8] So he jumped up and started to walk, and he entered the temple with them-walking, leaping, and praising God.

Summary of What is Known About the Lame Man:

- He was lame from birth and over 40 years old. Acts 4:22
- He regularly begged at the temple gate called Beautiful, and he was well known by many people who frequented the temple.
- He expected to receive money from Peter and John, but instead, he was healed in the name of Jesus Christ.
- The healing was instant and complete, resulting in him walking, leaping, and praising God.
- His healing became a public testimony that led to further evangelism and a confrontation with the religious leaders.
