- [10] We always carry the death of Jesus in our body, so that the life of Jesus may also be displayed in our body.




Recognize the Treasure Within

JARS OF CLAY

Fragile earthenware jars were common in Paul's day. Thus, they provided an apt metaphor for illustrating the fragility of human messengers in contrast to the valuable treasure of the message of salvation. The light of the gospel is the treasure that even Satan cannot take away. Clay pots leak, they chip, they aren't very attractive. By design they are simply functional. Their plain appearance doesn't detract from their contents. Often, we are discouraged by our imperfections. Feeling inadequate, we feel ineffective. These verses teaches, however, that our imperfect humanity is no hindrance to God's holy purpose. A person's flaws, scars, chips, and cracks allow the presence of an all-sufficient God to leak out. List everything about you that you wish were different. In what areas of your life do you feel inadequate? Can you thank God for the way he has "wired" you? Many will see Christ in you and be drawn to him because they relate more easily to someone who isn't perfect.
